If My Kingdom were of this world, My servants would certainly strive that I should not be delivered to the Jews; but now My Kingdom is not from hence. Thou sayest that I am a King. (John 18:37) That is, I am in truth the King of the Jews, as thou sayest; i.e., I am the Messias or the Christ, so that I may rule over the faithful by faith and grace, and bring them to the heavenly Kingdom. For that is the meaning of this Hebraism.

For this was I born, and for this came I into the world; that I should give testimony to the truth. That I might preach the Gospel truth, which consists mainly in three things:

1. In the true knowledge of God, namely, that the gods of the Gentiles are false, and that He is one in essence, and three-fold in Persons, namely the Father, Son, and Holy Ghost. For the true is a passion [understood philosophically as a category] of being, as is the good. For every being is true, i.e., a true and not imaginary thing, and is good in itself. Therefore God, who is Being itself, as Scripture says, I am Who am, by the same token is likewise Truth, and Goodness itself. Because He is in essence Being, Truth and Goodness. Again, the Son who proceedeth from the Father, as His Word, is Truth itself, not merely of existence but of mind. Hence St. Augustine says, "When Jesus bears witness to the truth, He bears witness to Himself, for He Himself is Truth.

2. In the knowledge of the Incarnation of the Word; namely, to know that the Son was sent by God the Father into the world in the flesh, that He might save the world; therefore no one can obtain salvation, except by faith in Him, as it says in John 17:3. This is eternal life: That they may know thee, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast sent.

3. In the knowledge of true blessedness: to wit, that it consists not in wealth, honors, pleasures, knowledge, or earthly kingdoms, as the philosophers taught; but rather in the kingdom of heaven, i.e., in the vision and possession of God. Hence the sum of Christ's preaching was this: Do penance: for the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand.

Everyone that is of the truth heareth My voice. Those are said to be of the truth who are studious and desirous of the truth; who earnestly and with their whole heart seek the Truth, i.e., the true God and the true Messias, true happiness and salvation. And who, when they have found it, embrace it above all things. They are opposed to them that are contentious (Romans 2:8), who, like

the philosophers of that time, are ever striving to contend, dispute, and argue. To be, then, of the truth is the same as being of God. For whoever is a son of God is a son of the truth; for God is truth, as it says in John 8:47.

What is truth? Listen to Lactantius pointing out its three degrees.

1. The first degree is to know what religions are false, and to cast aside the impious worship of gods crafted by human hands.

2. To perceive with the mind that there is one supreme God, whose power and providence created the world at the first, and governed it afterwards.

3. To recognize His minister and messenger whom He sent to earth as His ambassador. By whose teaching He shall set us free from the error in which we were entangled, that being fashioned for the worship of the true God we might learn justice.

What is truth? I am the way, the truth, and the life, says Christ. What is truth? "It is the very highest good," says St. Basil. What is truth? "It is the faculty which brings to the light things which are shrouded in darkness," says Philo. What is truth? "Truth is the mightiest of all things," says St. Gregory Nazianzen. What is truth? "It is a firm apprehension of an object in the mind," says St. Chrysostom. Hence the saying of Zorobabel, "A king is strong, wine is strong, women are strong, but truth is strongest of all" (3 Esdras 3). Zorobabel adds in that same book (4:36), "All the earth invokes truth, Heaven also blesses it, and all creatures are moved by, and tremble at it." And in verse 40, "There is no iniquity in its judgment, but strength and sovereignty and power, and the majesty of all ages. Blessed be the God of truth."

Accordingly, Alphonso King of Aragon says, "Truth must be innate in all men. But it ought to be the chief ornament of kings, so that a single word of a prince ought to be of as great weight for settling the truth as the oath of private men." Hence the Aaronic high priest bore written on his breastplate (Rationali) Urim vetummim, i.e., "Doctrine and truth" (Exodus 28). (*The Great Commentary of Cornelius à Lapide*)
